- Co-create projects to engage diverse communities and promote equity and inclusion

- interested in inclusive leadership and advocacy
- keen to develop a local project to advance equity and inclusion in Peel region
- ready to contribute to your community, through your work or in an informal community role

- interested in building on your lived experience as a member of a diverse group or community
- inspired by the incredible diversity around you and keen to maximize its potential
- available one Saturday per month to participate in full-day, in-person trainings, and prepared to commit time for collaboration and work between sessions

Applications will be accepted until midnight, Tuesday October 1, 2019.

Only 35 spots are available. While all applications will be considered, our goal is to achieve a diverse group of participants. You'll be asked to provide some information about how you identify.

What to expect from the training

The training runs from January to September 2020 and includes in-person sessions, some after-hours teamwork and collaboration, and self-reflection activities to be completed individually.

As part of the training, you'll collaborate with other participants to design and complete a Community Project.

The total time commitment is about 12-15 hours per month over nine months:

- 7 monthly Saturday sessions from 9:30 am 4:30 pm
- teamwork and personal reflection work (averaging 5 7 hours per month)
- 2 shorter CLP events (a launch and closing celebration at the beginning and end of the program)

The curriculum has been revised in consultation with a committee of stakeholders and alumni Community Ambassadors with expertise in diversity, equity, inclusion and community-building.
